The SERP project is a European initiative aimed at providing information, tools, and training for workers' organisations. Its primary focus is the healthcare sector, ensuring that employee representatives are better prepared to respond to the challenges and changes occurring in their workplaces.

These changes require employees to adapt, yet their representative organisations often lack adequate preparation to support them effectively. Key issues identified include:

- Limited capacity to anticipate future challenges
- Weak influence on working conditions
- Low involvement in change management
- No unified trade union strategy to respond to sectoral changes and restructuring responsibly

Context

The European healthcare sector is facing continuous challenges due to a rapidly changing environment. These include the impacts of recent crises such as COVID-19 and the war in Ukraine, as well as:

- · Reorganisation of work
- Staff shortages
- Increased demand from an ageing population
- Digitalisation, including artificial intelligence
- The need for socially responsible institutional functioning







Project Objectives

- To build the capacity of workers' organisations to anticipate and manage restructuring in the healthcare sector.
- To develop a strategic action plan and a practical manual for trade union representatives.
- To deliver innovative training modules focused on employment law, soft skills, digitalisation, and crisis response.
- To foster cooperation between healthcare trade unions across EU and candidate countries.

Key Activities

- International workshops and online events
- Development of a change management strategy and manual
- Creation of online training modules (in multiple languages)
- Dissemination of newsletters, vodcasts, publications, and social media content
- Active involvement of EU and nationallevel trade union experts
